

# **Voter Registration**

You may register to vote if:

You are 18 years of age on Election Day

A U.S. citizen

A legal resident of Abbeville County

Are not currently serving a sentence or parole for a felony conviction

Are not declared mentally incompetent by a court of law

You may present proper Identification to the Abbeville County Office of Registration & Elections in the basement of the Abbeville County Courthouse, Court Square, Abbeville, SC.

You may choose, instead, to register by mail. A registration form is available at various places in the county including the Abbeville County Library and political party offices. You might also call the Registration & Elections office to request a mail application be sent to you.

A citizen may come to the office up to 30 days before an election to register to vote in that election. Registration by mail forms must be postmarked no later than 30 days prior to the election.

Once a person has registered, there is no need to re-register unless they move out of Abbeville County or they are convicted of a felony.

Duplicate Voter Registration certificates are available upon request.

Once registered, a person is eligible to vote in all elections as determined by his/her place of residence. Districts are listed on the stub portion of the voter registration card. Representatives can be determined by these districts as well.
